Family Support Partners (FSP) work with families who are in need of additional supports and linkages to other services, programs and community resources.

Family Support Partners are experienced and understanding parents that have successfully navigated complex systems and who have achieved positive outcomes for children who have emotional and behavioral difficulties.

Services can be provided in home or in the community where you reside.

What Can A Family Support Partner Do?

- Support and encourage families going through difficult times.
- Partner with parents to navigate through systems such as:
 - The Department of Children & Family Services (CFS)
 - Schools
 - Mental Health
 - Medical
- Meet one on one with your family in the home, clinic and community.
- Support your family at meetings and hearings such as:
 - Court
 - Team Decisions Making (TDM)
 - Individual Education Program (IEP)
- Provide resources, referrals and information
- Assist your family to build a support network - faith, family and friends

Who Is Eligible To Receive A Family Support Partner?

To be eligible for a Family Support Partner you must live in the county of San Bernardino and be caring for a child that is 0-5 years old.
